#### **ADP Mission Statement and Ohio Revised Code of creation**

#### Mission Statement

To provide the highest level of technology in the most effective and efficient manner in the most realistic timeframe for the most reasonable cost. Advising agencies of new technologies, deploying equipment in a timely fashion, coordinating procurement, system implementation, and maintenance. Finally playing a key role in your business process attempting to improve competitiveness, efficiency, and communications.

#### Ohio Revised Code

#### 307.84 Establishing automatic data processing board.

The board of county commissioners of any county may, by resolution, establishes a county automatic data processing board. The board shall consist of the county treasurer or the county treasurer's representative, the county recorder or the county recorder's representative, the clerk of the court of common pleas or the clerk's representative, a member or representative of the board of county commissioners chosen by the board, two members or representatives of the board of elections chosen by the board of elections one of whom shall be a member of the political party receiving the greatest number of votes at the most recent general election for the office of governor and one of whom shall be a member of the political party receiving the second greatest number of votes at such an election, if the board of elections desires to participate, and the county auditor or the county auditor's representative who shall serve as secretary. The members of the county automatic data processing board may by majority vote add to the board any additional members whose officers use the facilities of the board.

After the initial meeting of the county automatic data processing board, no county office shall purchase, lease, operate, or contract for the use of any automatic or electronic data processing or record-keeping equipment, software, or services without prior approval of the board.

As used in sections <u>307.84</u> to <u>307.846</u> of the Revised Code, "county office" means any officer, department, board, commission, agency, court, or other office of the county, other than a board of county hospital trustees.

Herein please find the Geauga County Automatic Data Processing (ADP) Board's 2020 Annual Report. With the COVID-19 pandemic, 2020 proved to be a year of adjustment, change, and flexibility for ADP. In addition to fulfilling its primary mission of providing Information Technology to Geauga County and other public entities, ADP was called upon to assist with providing alternate work environment equipment for a large number of county employees serving every aspect of county government.

ADP assisted in obtaining, purchasing, configuring, and deploying hundreds of laptop computers, peripherals, small scale printers/scanners, and other devices that permitted the Geauga County's government to continue operations from remote locations and still serve the taxpayers.

ADP additionally launched a series of long-term initiatives designed to set the stage for a wholesale revamping of Geauga County's internet presence. At the core of this initiative was the preparation of a functional specification and design document for a central datastore application programming interface (API) that will manage specific county-wide data in a single location. This will allow the updating of common data across multiple platforms and Geauga County offices. This central datastore API will also make available data mining to taxpayers through our new web initiative while increasing our accountability and transparency.

Internal to the county, ADP launched eSuite, a portal extension of the county's enterprise resource planning (ERP) tool offering human resource (HR) and benefits information and documentation to employees online, thus reducing paper flow and labor overhead.

On behalf of the entire ADP team, a special thank you to the ADP Board for their continued involvement, confidence, support, and guidance. ADP remains committed to improvement, transparency, and serving the needs of its customers.




#### The 2020 Infrastructure

The IT environment is composed of 3 Main Campuses, 3 primary Satellite locations and various smaller satellite locations. 169 Servers provide Business Applications, email, file storage and printer services to over 900 end users. Tying all this together are 79 managed Cisco L2 and L3 Switches, 11 routers and firewalls in a backbone/campus environment, supporting 68 Virtual Lan (VLANS) that insures both performance and speed requirements of high-speed disk/file system access (10Gbit). The Wireless Infrastructure 85 Meraki Access Points placed in county facilities providing for central management. The 3 main campus sites are Connected by way of fiber and configured in a 'ring' topology to reduce downtime in the event of fiber leg outage.
